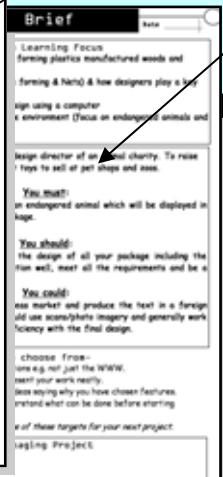
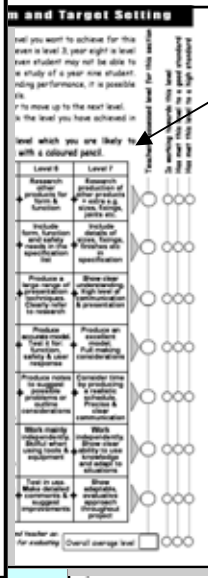


Workbook Content

Research often involves cut and paste to make a mood board based on a theme with recommended websites given.

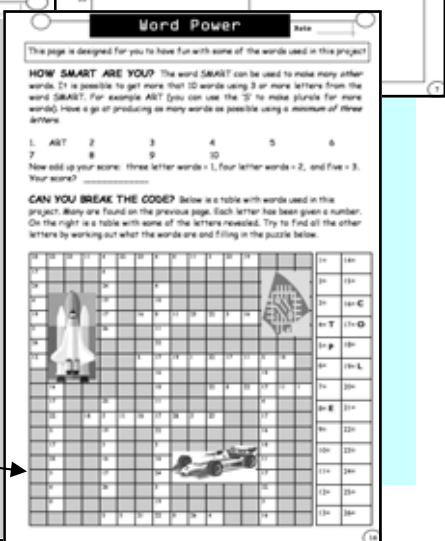
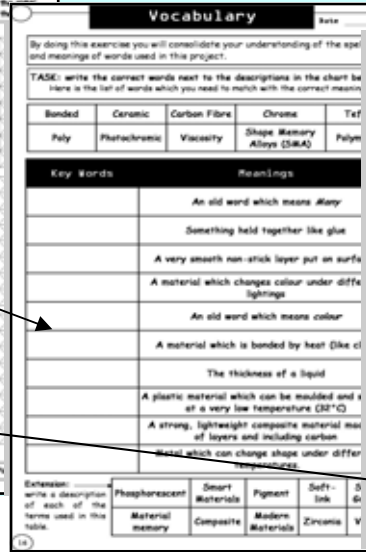
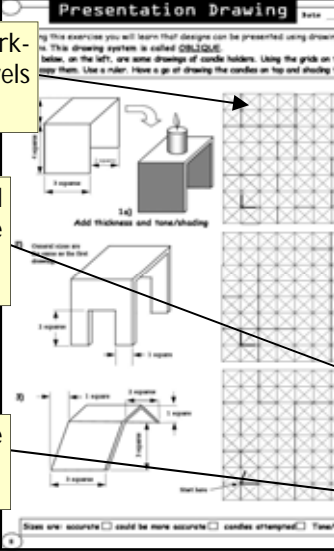
A 'similar products' survey resulting in a bar chart.
